A more tolerant man than Milner may have tried longer to achieve a new form of state in the Transvaal without force; a more circumspect man than Chamberlain may have advised Salisbury to restrain or even recall their man on the spot: as it was, the anti-war Butler was the one recalled and not the pro-war Milner. Perhaps the "single most prominent member of the educated elite" before the war, Jabavu continued to profess his loyalty to the British empire, while criticizing the war policies of Milner and Chamberlain, to the extent that his newspaper, Imvo Zabantsundu, was shut down in August p.
